Incised, Bitten and Gouged: Anchor Graphics and the Chicago Printmakers Collaborative, 20 Years of Printmaking

[Anchor Graphics](#) and [Chicago Print Makers Collaborative](#) demonstrates a decisive command of the printmaking medium using a variety of techniques. July 30 – Sept. 12, 2010 Opening Reception: July 30, 6 – 9pm. Incised, Bitten and Gouged, three printmaking terminologies, alludes to the numerous printmaking techniques represented in this group exhibition. Artists from CPC and Anchor Graphics will show works made in intaglio, silkscreen, embossment, woodcut, lithography and various innovations on traditional printmaking techniques. For a little over two decades, CPC and Anchor Graphics have stood as two of the central printmaking institutions in Chicago. Incised, Bitten and Gouged offers a terrific opportunity to survey the recent

creative outpouring from two of Chicago's acclaimed printmaking collaborative studios.
